NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

Tatiana Bell (she/her) is a multi-disciplinary interaction designer and visual artist who is currently graduating with a B.S in Interactive Design and a minor in Technical Communication from Kennesaw State University. Meanwhile, she is leading design projects, pursuing her artistic career, interning with the Community Engagement and Arts team at Atlanta Regional Commission, and bidding adieu to her beloved position at the Zuckerman Museum of Art to embark on a new journey as Communications Manager for Living Walls. Tatiana's work is as intersectional as her identity. As a mixed (Black, Greek, and Persian if you're wondering) queer female-identifying person, there are limited accessible spaces to which she inherently "belongs." She overcomes this challenge by embracing the possibilities of creating spaces that do not yet exist for herself and others.

Tatiana's creative journey has consisted of making visual art, designing interactive personal projects, arts-and-culture-focused research, leading community discussions, and planning, installing, and participating in local exhibitions and events. This journey began in 2018 when she started her employment at the Zuckerman Museum of Art (ZMA). Tatiana's position at the ZMA introduced her to her favorite artists, mediums, and the practices of art handling, installation, and curation. Her years there presented her with opportunities to explore her work as an interaction designer beyond the virtual realm and into the physical space of the museum to identify the needs of guests and employees and propose solutions to improve the overall experience. The ZMA also fueled her visual art practice by donating large pieces of paper that would have gone to waste otherwise.

In her visual work, Tatiana's journey of self-discovery and identity is realized through vibrant colors, geometric forms, and expressive scenes on paper. She currently works out of a storage unit and uses mediums most accessible to her—ink, pastels, and paint on paper as of late—to realize a meditative practice of expression and exploration of self and the spaces in which she exists. Her regular use of paper is a result of working in a museum that uses a lot of paper that would otherwise go to waste, and she finds solace in repurposing materials to create and escape the virtual spaces that control her day-to-day. Although she enjoys the limitations of these materials, she is setting out to explore alternative uses beyond producing images on paper. As someone who wants to uphold a sustainable practice, she hopes to find ways of producing work that is more accessible and functional to her audiences.

During the Leap Year residency, she will use the time and space to explore the possibilities of creating with paper and producing usable art. Feeling defeated by the large works piling up in her (storage) studio, she envisions her practice evolving to explore how the shapes, colors, and figures of her compositions translate to three-dimensional paper sculptures and interact with light. She is studying the feasibility of lantern, mobile, and paper-making to contemplate the possibilities of creating art that has a purpose beyond the point of production and thus evokes a sense of ownership and comfort to the user.

Through her work—whether on screens or on paper—her goal is to create meaningful and exciting experiences that explore the potential of her mediums and draw attention to physical spaces. She yearns to have a welcoming space to create, be on the ground with other artists, and immerse herself in the local arts community so as to draw inspiration and engage directly with those who are impacted by her work.
